Reconsider decision on IISc: Naveen to PM

BHUBANESWAR: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has urged Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to reconsider the decision to scrap the proposal to set up a science research institute of excellence on the model of Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore.

Expressing his displeasure over the UPA Government's decision to shift the proposed institute to Kolkata, Naveen in a letter to the Prime Minister has said the NDA Government had announced to set up four such institutes in the country including the one in Bhubaneswar.

The University Grants Commission had intimated the Centre's decision to the State Government in July 2003. Accordingly, the State Government had allocated land in favour of the proposed science institute.

The State has no institute of excellence like Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Indian Institute of Management (IIM) or Central University.

Since the State is poised for big industrialisation, an institute like IISc is highly necessary to take up research work in various fields of science.

The Chief Minister has cautioned that any deviation from the decision of the NDA Government will not be appreciated by the people of the State.
