**Advani to address BJP Yuva Morcha on Dec 9**

An estimated one lakh people are likely to take part in the December 9 Youth Awareness Convention in the city. BJP President Lal Krishna Advani, Jharkhand Chief Minister Arjun Munda, BJP Vice President Shahanawaj Hussain and TV actor cum politician Smruti Irani (Malhotra) are scheduled to take part in the convention which is being organised by the BJP Yuva Morcha on Friday.

Besides, President of the Orissa unit of the party Juel Oram and president of the BJP Yuva Morcha Dharmendra Pradhan and others will take part in the convention.

The convention will highlight among other things the indifferent attitude of the UPA Government toward Orissa and the current industrial policy of the State Government.

Mr Pradhan, under whose direct supervision the convention is being organised, said the convention will be wake up call for the State Government to ensure that the youths are made stakeholders in the industrial map of Orissa.

The pre-convention agenda note, prepared by Mr Pradhan and president of the State unit of the BJP Yuva Morcha Bhругu Baxipatra, has complemented the State Government for its 'no industry no-mine' policy. However, the leaders have urged the Government to ensure that the fruits of the fast industrialisation reach the youths of the State. The Government must make laws which would force industries to give preference to local people and those from the State, in employment, the note stated.

In the convention, the BJP Yuva Morcha will propose to the Government to bring in reformation in the current educational system which will guarantee jobs for the youth. The Government will also be urged to constitute a Youth Commission which will be mandated to form a futuristic employment policy and modernisation of the employment exchanges up to district levels.

Failure of commercial banks to earmark 5 per cent of their total advances for employment generation programme, shifting of the National Institute of Sciences by the UPA Government under pressure from the Left parties, slashing of kerosene and gas quota for the State by the Centre, excessive export of coal, bad shape of NHs in the State and sluggishness of the work under the Golden Quadrilateral, negligence of Centre towards railways of the State are some of the issues that the convention will highlight.
